

North Bath Allotment Trail

1. Lower Common West Allotments: Opening Times 11:00-13:00
 - Start your visit to the allotments in the city centre and the north at the entrance gate to Lower Common West Allotments opposite the Hop Pole pub on the Upper Bristol Road. Drop by the Bath Allotment Association Trading Hut at the entrance. Charlie Love will let you know all about the Bath Allotment Association. Follow the main path through the organic allotment site of Lower Common West. Take a look at the beautiful soil and the variety of crops grown on the site.
2. Bath Organic Group: Opening Times 10:00-12:00
 - As you walk through the site you will find Bath Organic Group (BOG) on the right. Here you will be invited to take a tour, see what they are growing/harvesting and have cup of tea and homemade cake.
3. Lower Common East Allotments: Opening Times 11:00-15:00
 - Leave Lower Common West through the gate onto the footpath. Cross the footpath and enter Lower Common East. Growers will be on site to show you around and give you information about how they are supporting wildlife and brewing their own liquid fertilisers.
4. The Urban Garden: Opening Times 10:30-16:30
 - Walk along the main path and leave Lower Common East onto Marlborough Buildings. Turn left and turn left again to enter Victoria Park. Here you will find the Urban Garden. Take a look at their wide range of garden, allotment and house plants. If you haven't already stopped off at BOG, refreshments are available at the Urban Garden.
Leave the Urban Garden and return to Marlborough Buildings. Turn left and then next left onto Cow Lane.
5. Ring Common Allotments: Opening Times 11:00-16:00
 - Ring Common Allotments are found on the right. Here there is the opportunity to have a look at what is grown on the site as well as taking part in fun activities for children.
6. High Common Allotments: Opening Times 11:00-15:00
 - Return onto Cow Lane and turn right. Enter Victoria Park and turn right (north) through the Park. At Weston Lane cross the road and follow the steep path north-west through the golf course to High Common, the entrance is on Sion Hill. It's a bit of a hike (20 minutes) but well worth it for the tremendous views over Bath and meet and talk to growers.
7. St Stephen's Millenium Green and Allotments: Opening Times: The Green is open access and Allotments are open between 14:00-16:00
 - Leave the allotment by the gate onto Sion Hill and head north up the hill. Turn right at the T junction and continue along Sion Hill. Cross Cavendish Road and continue along Sion Hill taking in Somerset Place and Lansdown Crescent on the way. Head south downhill to meet Lansdown Road. Turn left and head up Lansdown Hill. This is another steep part of the trail. At St Stephen's Church turn right onto Richmond Road. The gate to St Stephen's Millennium Green will be found 200m up from the church on the right.
 - The Millennium Green has a number of children's play activities as well as marvellous borders and views over the city from the top terrace. Walk through the Green and you will come to St Stephen's Allotments. The growers will be on the site to share with you some of their growing tips. This is where the trail ends. Well done, if you've made it all the way from the river to the upper slopes of Lansdown.
