Our New Bid for Funding

As many members will know, we are following on from our successful Water My Plot initiative by bidding for a second round of funds from the local Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). CIL is a planning charge levied by Local Authorities in England and Wales to raise funds from new building and infrastructure developments. The money raised is used to support local community projects. You can find details of our bid [here](#). The aim of the Phase 2 bid is to support the more efficient use of existing allotments by:

- increasing the numbers of people able to grow food by running smaller plots, rescuing hard-to-let plots and creating new plots.
- reducing wastage of plots caused by high-rate first-time failures by running microplots for first timers.
- Improving the quality, sustainability and biodiversity of the sites through better water capture and usage and wildlife initiatives.

Fingers crossed that we are successful.
